Summary of Project

For purposes of public statements and references in the annual reports, Council requires a short summary of the project written in terms that can be readily understood by the general public. Applicants are therefore requested to submit such a summary in about 200 words.

We propose to assemble a collection of essays, articles and passages from letters written by Karl Polanyi over a period of more than 50 years from 1909 to 1964. Some of this material has been published (in English, German or Hungarian), some represents finished manuscript and extracts from letters which have never been published. None of it is at present readily available in the English language. We do not propose to include any material from The Great Transformation, Trade, Money and Markets in Early Empires, Dahomey and the Slave Trade, the collection Primitive, Archaic and Modern Economies, Essays by Karl Polanyi edited by George Dalton, or the (forthcoming) posthumously published version of Polanyi's lecture on General Economic History presented at Columbia University (1947-53), edited by Harry W. Pearson of Bennington College, Vermont.

It is characteristic of the rich world of thought of Polanyi that the abovementioned books, wide-ranging as they are in subject matter, leave important gaps to be filled. One purpose of the proposed collection consists of the preparation for publication of writings by Karl Polanyi presently not accessible.

The project, however, extends beyond the task of selecting, editing and translating into English some of the literary legacy of Karl Polanyi. Our total purpose is to present and explain the world of thought of a man who was, throughout his life a socialist and a humanist. As I wrote in a short tribute published in the Journal Co-Existence in 1964:

"Mis life spans the period of modern socialism and, through his intellectual heritage, reaches beyond his 77 years which ended on April 23, 1964. All his life a socialist, he was never associated with any political party. Nor did he participate in any political movement. Never a doctrinaire, he many times cut across the main trends of debate within the socialist movements of Europe. Although not a Marxist, he was much less a Social Democrat. Although a humanist, he was eminently a realist. Although aware of the reality of society, and the constraints which this reality places upon the actions, values and ideas of all of us who inescapably live in society, his life was guided by an inner necessity to exercise freedom of action and thought and never to give in to determinism or fatalism. Hence the quotation from Hegel which he many times cited ("Brich mit dem Frieden in Dir/Brich mit dem Werte der Welt/Besseres nicht, als die Zeit/Aber auf's Bestern sie sein.")

The selections will be presented in chronological order. They fall into five parts representing Polanyi's contribution to the student and intellectual movement of Hungary over the years 1908-19; the Vienna period (1919-34); contributions to the Christian Left movement of the late 1930's in England and other writings pre-dating his permanent move to North America in 1947; the Columbia University period; and finally his Lebendsabend, in Pickering, Ontario:

The volume will be prefaced by two substantial introductory essays, one of which will be primarily biographical, the other directed at the continuities and contradictions in Polanyi's social philosophy, as illustrated in this collection. The interpretative essay will focus on the relevance of Polanyi's world of ideas to the comtemporary social problem of man in an industrial society. The former (biographical) essay will be written by Mrs. Ilona Polanyi, the latter by myself.

It can readily be appreciated that this project cannot easily be described under the headings suggested here. The objective has been indicated in the Summary of Project (see above). The significance is twofold: a) the preparation for publication of writings for the most part hitherto unpublished in the English language of a man whose world of thought is widely acknowledged to be of relevance to the contemporary human condition and b) the production of a biographical and an interpretive essay by the applicants who are, as it happens, the widow and the daughter of Karl Polanyi. It should be noted that the literary legacy of Karl Polanyi rests with Mrs. Polanyi and myself. We wish to take the opportunity of making available a collection of Polanyi's writings (including a number of transcripts which have never been published) which faithfully reflect his thoughts over a lifespan of some fifty years.

The proposed biographical essay cannot be prepared by anybody else except Mrs. Polanyi. We are in my view, more than fortunate that Mrs. Polanvi is both willing and able to contribute her collaboration.

As for the interpretive essay which I wish to prepare, my intention is to bypass the more narrowly academic aspect of Polanyi's influence on economic authropology, for example, so ably documented in essays such as the one by C.S. Humphreys, "History, Economics and Authropology: the work of Karl Polanyi" (History and Theory, Vol. TII, No. 2, 1969, Weslyan University Press); I wish to focus on the most general theme of the social philosophy implicit in Polanyi's writings - as illustrated in the proposed collection, in the works referred to in the 'Summary of Project' and in Polanyi's lecture notes on "External Economic History" delivered at Columbia University in 1947-52 presently being prepared for publication by Professor Harry W. Pearson of Bennington College. In order to capture and document the resonance of Polanyi's work, we propose to survey comtemporary (principally North American) writings in the general area of the social science to establish explicit references to Polanyi and some implicit similarities of approach.

We append a highly preliminary and incomplete list of proposed contents. Some pieces will require polished translations into English, either from Hungarian or from German. In other cases there exist a number of alternative versions of unpublished essays (some completed; some incomplete) and there is a formidable task of selecting and editing. We propose to include one or two important articles previously published in the English language but not easily available to the reader (i.e. not included in Dalton's collection, nor in Pearsons's new book). Furthermore, there remain a con-

Each selection will be accompanied by a brief explanatory note relating to previous publication dates, context, our reasons for choice of one rather than another of similar unpublished drafts, and, where necessary, to the dating of the piece. (Polanyi had the habit of returning to a previously written draft, and making changes sometimes many years later; in the case of some of the unpublished writings, dating presents a minor excercise in research). More comprehensive explanations of content will, of course, be covered in the introductory essays.

I am, of course, aware that this project is an unusual one. Karl Polanyi's life and work span space (Hungary, Austria, England and New York-Pickering) and more than half a century of time. We are immensely fortunate in the fact that Ilona Polanyi shared with her husband the fullness of their life and their common committment to a humane and socialist order of society. She is also the only person who is able to recall and explain the content of my father's work and writings, particularly in the formative, crucial and long period of years which preceded his well known career, as an 'academic' in North America. As for my credentials concerning this project, they are to be found in the fact that my professional work as an economist was motivated, and continues to be motivated by that same quest for a society in which economic institutions are subordinated to human basic requirements and social needs. I believe I have the capacity, and also the responsibility, to indicate some guidelines to the understanding of the coherence which underlies the variety in the works of Karl Polanyl.

Summary of Project

For purposes of public statements and references in the annual reports, Council requires a short summary of the project written in terms that can be readily understood by the general public. Applicants are therefore requested to submit such a summary in about 200 words.

We propose to assemble a collection of essays, articles and passages from letters written by Karl Polanyi over a period of more than 50 years from 1909 to 1964. Some of this material has been published (in English, German or Hungarian), some represents finished manuscript and extracts from letters which have never been published. None of it is at present readily available in the English language. We do not propose to Include any material from The Great Transformation, Trade, Money and Markets in Early Empires, Dahomey and the Slave Trade, the collection Primitive, Archaic and Modern Economics, Essays by Karl Polanyi edited by George Dalton, or the (forthcoming) posthumously published version of Polanyi's lecture on Ceneral Economic History presented at Columbia University (1947-53), edited by Harry W. Pearson of Bennington College, Vermont.

It is characteristic of the rich world of thought of Polanyi that the abovementioned books, wide-ranging as they are in subject matter, leave important gaps to be filled. Research [Input-Output]

Aside from the research which is implicit in the list of publications, I have been engaged in the construction of Input-Output accounts for each of the four Atlantic Provinces of Canada since 1961. This work has been located in the Dominion Bureau of Statistics (now Statistics Canada) and was carried out under my personal supervision over the past eleven years. Interindustry flow tables of 71 industrial, 18 final using and 20 primary input sectors were constructed for the year 1960 and were later updated to 1965. These tables have been used by a number of provincial and federal government agencies and departments for a variety of purposes. The work has received the financial support of the Social Science Research Council (1961); Atlantic Provinces Research Council (1967-4); Atlantic Development Board (1964-67); Canada Council (1967); and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics (1968 - 72). I am at this time engaged in completing a report on the System of Accounts, the Input-Output Models, Sources and Methods, etc. which will accompany the publication of this work.

Explorations

Explorations

The Explorations program offers grants to encourage new and developing forms of creativity, research, participation and diffusion of the arts, humanities and social sciences. This program replaces and extends the scope of the Canadian Horizons program.

Unlike other Canada Council programs, Explorations is not directed exclusively towards specialists and professional artists. Grants may be made to any applicant whose proposed project is judged to be deserving of assistance.

Eligible Projects

Projects must concern Canadian situations or subjects, or have implications for Canada, Outlined below, by way of illustration only, are some types of projects which would be considered eligible:

 explorations of new forms of expression, participation, communication and diffusion

sociocultural projects or activities directed by competent persons

 multidisciplinary research and experimentation related to both the arts and sciences

work in the field of popular culture

work in any medium on Canada's historical or cultural heritage (the history of a region, community or institution, personal memoirs, facets of contemporary Canadian life).

Undertakings of an essentially commercial nature are ineligible for assistance. Nor may grants be obtained from the Explorations program for new projects of the types illustrated, innovative or not, if they are eligible for assistance under another Canada Council program (for example, aid to writing, aid to the publication or translation of books, awards to artists and university students, aid to university research, operating grants to established arts organizations, etc.).

Eligible Applicants

Applications for grants may be submitted by:

Canadian citizens

 landed immigrants wito have resided in Canada for no less than 3 years

· Canadian organizations.

Amounts of Grants

The amount of a grant will depend on the duration and cost of the project submitted, and will not be subject to any ceiling. However, as the program budget is limited, competition for grants will be rigorous. Applicants are advised to exercise moderation in determining the scope of their projects and to present a realistic project budget.

Selection Process

Taking into consideration the objectives of the program, the principal criteria of evaluation will be the quality and potential appeal of projects, and the ability of applicants to carry them out. Selections will be made through competitions (three of which are scheduled for 1974-75) involving two stages. Applications will first be sorted according to the areas from which they orignated (the Atlantic provinces, Quebec, Ontario, the Prairies, and British Columbia) and sent to five regional juries, who will make an initial selection. In the second stage, all the recommendations of the regional juries will be reviewed by a committee composed of the chairmen of these juries. Within the limits of available funds, this committee will make a final selection and submit its recommendations to the Canada Council The results of each competition will be announced four months after the deadline for applications. (Def 1)

The Canada Council reserves the right to interpret the conditions of the program and how they apply to specific cases.

How to Apply

Special application forms must be used. On these forms, the applicant is asked for a detailed description of the project and a proposed budget. When asking for application forms, it is important to specify whether the grant is being requested by an individual or an organization.

The next deadline for applications is June 1, 1974.



Our total purpose is to present and explain the world of thought of a man who was, throughout his life above all a socialist and a humanistwe are here concerned to reveal the social philosophy which underlies the work of Karl Polanyilt is the objective of the proposed project which distinguishes it from other commentaries on his work. As Kari Levitt wrote in a short tribute published in the Journal Co-Existence in 1964: "(Polanyi's) life spans the period of modern socialism and, through his intellectual heritage, reaches beyond his 77 years which ended on April 23rd, 1964. All his life a socialist, he was never associated with any political party. Nor did he participate in any political movement, Never a dectrinaire, he many times cut across the main trends of debate within the socialist movements of Europe. The selections will be presented in chronological order. They fall into five parts, representing 1. Polanyi's contribution to the student and intellectual movement and Hungary over the years 1908-19; 2. the Vienna period (1919-33); 3. contributions to the Christian Left movement of the 1930's in England and other writings pre-dating his permanent move to North America in 1947; 4. the Columbia University period; and finally, 5. Lebensabend in Pickering, Ontario.

The volume will be prefaced by two substantial introductory essays. One, by Ilona Duczynska Polanyi will be biographical. The other, by Kari Levitt Polanyi will be interpretative and will address itself to

the major themes and influences in Polanyi's social philosophy as revealed in this collection and in the major published works (The Great Transformation, etc). Ilona Polanyi is the widow and Kari Tevitt the daughter of Karl Polanyi. It should be noted that the literary legacy of Karl Polanyi rests jointly with Mrs. Polanyi and Mrs. Levitt.

After Karl Polanyi retired from teaching at Columbia University, in 1954, I withdrew from my own profession in science to be an aide to him in his continued researches and writings. (My own studies had been in Mathematics and Physics at Zurich; Vienna and finally London, where I became an Associate Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society; I had worked as a Technical Officer at the Royal Aircraft Establishment, Farnborough; as an Assistant at Imperial College; at the Royal Institution; as Lecturer at Bennington College, Vermont; lastly as an Assistant at the Department of Aerodynamics, University of Toronto.)

A lifelong interest (running neck to neck with that in science) in contemporary history, in the social sciences, in the theory and practice of socialist movements, as well as the tri-lingualism we shared (English, German, Hungarian) made it possible for me to be of some assistance to Karl Polanyi in the last ten years of his life. In the ten years following his death I continued to work on literary translations from Hungarian into English, guided by the desire to make available in the West works of eminent Communist writers, that bear message of humanism, creative art and independence of mind. Recently I completed several years' research into the contemporary history of Austria; the finished manuscript (300 pages) has been submitted to publishers.



Description of Project

We propose to assemble a collection of essays, articles and passages from letters written by Karl Polanyl over a period of more than 50 years from 1909 to 1964. Some of this material has been published (in English, German or Hungarian), some represents finished manuscript and extracts from letters which have never been published. None of it is at present readily available in the English language. We do not propose to include any naterial from The Great Transformation, Trade, Money and Markets in Early Empires, Dahomey and the Slave Trade, the collection Primitive, Archeic and Modern Economics, Essays by Karl Polanyi edited by Ceorge Dalton, or the (forthcoming) posthumously published version of Polanyi's Lecture on General Economic History presented at Columbia University (1947-53), edited by Harry W. Pearson of Bennington College, Vermont.

It is characteristic of the rich world of thought of Polanyi that the above-mentioned books, wide-ranging in subject matter, leave important gaps to be filled. The primary purpose of the proposed collection is not however the publication of writings presently not available, important as that is.

The primary purpose is rather to present and explain the world of thought of a man who was, throughout his life a socialist and a humanist. As I wrote in a short tribute published in the Journal Co-Existence in 1984:

"His life spans the period of modern socialism and, through his intellectual heritage, reaches beyond his 77 years which ended on April 23 1964. All his life a socialist, he was never associated with any political party. Nor did he participate in any political movement. Never a doctrinaire, he many times cut across the main trends of debate within the socialist movements of Europe. Although not a Marxist, he was much less a Social Democrat. Although a humanist, he was eminently a realist. Although aware of the reality of society, and the constraints which this reality places upon the actions, values and ideas of all of us who inescapably live in

society, his life was guided by an inner hecessity to exercise freedom of action and thought and never to give in to determinism or fatalism. Hence the quotation from Hegel which he many times cited ("Brich mit dem Frieden in Dir/ Brich mit dem Werte der Welt/ Besseres nicht, als die Zeit/ Aber auf's Bestern sie sein.")

The selections will be presented in chronological order. They fall into five parts representing Polanyi's contribution to the student and intellectual movement of Hungary over the years 1908-19; the Vienna period (1919-34); contributions to the Christian Left movement of the late 1930's in England and other writings pre-dating his permanent move to North America in 1947; the Columbia University, which might be called the Pickering period.

The volume will be prefaced by two substantial introductory essays, one of which will be primarily biographical, the other directed at the continuities and contradictions in Polanyi's social philosophy, as illustrated in this collection. The interpretative essay will focus on the relevance of Polanyi's world of ideas to the contemporary social problem of man in an industrial society.

In order to capture and document the resonance of Polanyi's work, we propose to survey contemporary (primarily North American) writings in the general area of social philosophy to establish explicit references to Polanyi and implicit similarities of approach. The area of research will attempt to exclude the more narrowly academic aspect of Polanyi's influence documented in essays such as by C.S. Humphreys "History, Economics and Anthropology: the work of Karl Polanyi in History and Theory, Vol. III, No. 2 1969 Weslayan University Press.

We append a highly <u>preliminary</u> and <u>incomplete</u> list of proposed contents. Some pieces will require polished translations into English, either from Hungarian or from German. In other cases there exist a number of alternative versions of unpublished essays, and there is the task of selecting and editing. We propose also to include one or two important articles previously published in the English language but not easily available to the reader (i.e. not included in Dalton's collection, nor in Pearson's manuscript). Furthermore, there remains a considerable number of letters and manuscripts which have never been systematically sifted and sorted. (These are in addition to the eight files of material deposited in the Special Library of Columbia University in 1965).

As regards to previously unpublished work, it should be noted that the literary legacy of Karl Polanyi rests with Mrs. Polanyi and myself. We thus propose to take the opportunity of making available writings which, although unpublished, are in our opinion, sufficiently significant to reflect faithfully Polanyi's thoughts.

Karl Polanyi: Socialist, Humanist: A Collection of His Writings, 1908-1964

Description of Project

We propose to assemble a col ection of essays, articles and passages from letters written by Karl Polanyi over a period of more than 50 yearrs from 1909 to 1964. Some of this ma terial has been published (in English, German or Hungarian), some represents finished manuscript and extracts from letters which has never been published. None of it is at present readily available in the Entlish languate. We do not propose to inclue any material from The Great Transformation, Trade Money and Markets in Early Empirres, Dahomey and the Slave Tred, or the collection Primitive, Archaic and Modern Economies, Essays by Karl Polanyi edited by George Dalton, nor om the (forthcoming) posthumously publushed version of Polanyi's lectures o General Economic History presented at Columbia University(1947-53), being prepared by Harry W.Pearson of Bennington Vollege, Vermont.

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The volume will be prefaced by tw substantial introductory essays, one of which will be primarily biographical, the other directed at the continuities and contradictions in Polanyi's social philosophy, as illustrated in this collection. The interpretative essay will focus on the relevance of Polanyi's world of ideas to the general social problem of man in industrial sociarty.

When necessary, the selections will be accompanied by explanatory notes. These will be kept to a minimum and will record context, where necessary, e.g. context of extracts from letters; explanations relating to mammamam our choice of alternative drafts and versions of essays, etc. These notes will provide specific information additional to that contained in the two comprehensive biographical essays.

Selected Photographs

We propose a carefully selected set of photographs which capture Polanyi's life from his youth in Hungary to his Lebensabend in Pickering, Ontario.

Polányi Károly /Bécs 1886.okt.21. - Toronto, Kanada 1964.ápr.23./ gazdaságtörténész, szociálfilozófus, társadalompolitikus, 1947-1953-ig (a korhatár eléréséig) a new-yorki Columbia Egyetem vendégprofeeszora. Pelgári értelmiségi, apja vasutépitő mérnök volt, anyja Vilnából származott. Szüleivel még kiskorában Bécsból Budapestre kerül. Egyetemi tanulmányait a budapesti egyetem jogi karán végzi, előbb a "ezocialista diákok" ezervezetének tagja, majd annak elvérszegényedése után egyik alapító tagja s egyben első elnöke a polgári, haladó gondolkodásu egyetemi ifjuság egyesületének, az 1908-ben alakult Galilei Körmek. A Körben tevékeny előadói munkássagot fejt ki s folyóiratuknak, a Szabadgondolatmak 1911-1914 között egyik legtermékenyebb cikkirója. Irásai elsősorban a társadalomtudományokkal foglalkoznak. Irt a nyugati polgári szociológia művelőinek elméleteiről, az orosz - tolsztojánus - felfogásról. Az első világháburu idején katonai szolgálatot teljesit, 1918-ban a frontről nagybetegen hazatér, majd átveszi az ujraindult Szabadgondolat szerkesztését /1918 okt. - 1919.febr./, Jászi Oszkár polgári radikális csoportjához meatlakozik. A Tanácsköztársaság idején, 1919 juniusában Bécsbe kerül korházba. 1920-ban, a bécsi emigrācióban ismerkedik meg a Galilei per - a Galilei Kör illegalis, forradalmi szocialista csoportja ellen 1918-ban lefolytatott per - mo volt fővádlottjával, Duczynska Thonával, akivel 1923-ban házassagot köt. 1921-24 között a Bécsi Magyar Ujság munkatársa. 1924-1933-ig az Oesterreichischer Volkswirt nemzetközi és külpolitikai rovatának vezetője. A bécsi Volkshochschule-ban és az ottani szocialista diákok szervezetében gazdaságelméleti és gazdaságtörténeti előadásokat tart. A politikai párthoz nem csatlakozott Polányit az osztrák - s magyar emigráns - baloldaliak polgárnak, mély humanizmusáról tanuskodó irásai miatt a jobbeldali politikai körök viszont meggyőződött szocialistának tartják. A fasizmus erősödésével elveszti

állását a polgári liberális Gesterreichischer Volkswirtnál és elhagyja Ausztriát. Angliában az oxfordi és londoni egyetemeknek az egyetemen kivüli felnőtt-oktatással foglalkozó szerve /Extramural Delegacy/ megbizásából tart 1-3 éves tanfolyamokat a gazdaságtörténet és a világpolitika problémaköreiből. 1940-ben világpolitikai előkörutra megy az Egyesült Államok nagyszámu egyetemére. K már Angliában kialakult gazdaságtörténeti elgendolásait 1941-42 folyamán irja meg Bennington Collegeben, a Rockefeller Alapitvány támogatásával, a nagy érdeklődést mendmű kiváltó történelemfilozófiai és gazdaságtörténeti mankájában.

1943-ban visszatér Angliába ahol hovább folytatja régi munkáját, a felnőtt-oktatást. Ugyanakkor, Károlyi Mihályék környezetében, mind nagyobb figyelmet szentel Duczynskával együtt a fasizmus elleni harcnak s a magyarországi fejleményeknek.

1947-ben, gezdaságtörténeti kutatásai alapján a new-yorki Columbia Egyetemre, közgazdaságtudományi tanszékre kap meghiváat mint vendég-professzor. Ezt az állást el is fogadja. Kanadában tudnak azonban csak otthont teremteni, mert Duczynskát – 1919-es multjára való tekintettel – nem engedik be az Egyesült Államokba. P. 1953-ig Kanada, illetve pickeringi minimum erdőszéli otthonuk és New York között osztja meg életét. Egyetemi előadásai saját szüntelen fejlődő gazdaságtörténeti elméletének anyagát ölelik fel s különösen a "veterán" /világháborut járt/ diákok között akadnak legkiválóbb tanitványai.

1953-1958-ig egy a Ford Alapitvány keretei között működő kutatócsoportot irányit C.M. Arensberg Columbia Egyetem-i kollégájával
együtt. Ezekben az években készül el egy sor empirikus tanulmány
az uj módszertani vizsgálódások eredményeként. Körzetük a pénz,
a külkereskedelem, a piachelyek történeti fejlődése s azok hatása a
társadalom egészére. 1957-ben jelenik meg Trade ami Market in the

Early Empires c. kötet amiben P. és haknahája tanitványai létrehozmaka egy uj, modern gazdaságtörténeti iskolának a módszertanát, segédtudományként felhasználva az antropológiát és szociográfiát, ami nem csak a gazdaságtörténet, hanem a közgazdasági antropológia fejlődésére is kihat.

Késői életéveiben, amik összessnek a hidegháború kiélesedésével,

Vizsgálja az iparosodás, a technológia - s technokrácia - jelentőpolgári

Tudományos munkássága mellett mind nagyobb felelősséggel fordul a magyar valóság felé. 1957-1959-ig feleságével közösen szerkeszti a modern magyar irodalom remekeiből válogatott The Plough and the Pen c. antológiájukat. /London és Toronto, 1963/

1963-ban feleségével együtt hazalátogat s a MTA szociológiai csoportjában ismerteti módszerét, valamint Gazdaságszociológia az Egyesült Államokban cimmel tart előadást a Közgazdasági Társaság és a Kulturális Kapcsolatok Intézete közös rendezésében.

Utolsó aktiv munkája a "Co-Existence" c. folyőirat életrehivása, amely a nyugati és a szecialista országok tudómainakmés mánhanam társadalomtudósainak közös munkásságát tözte ki céljául, a közgazdasátan, szociológia és politikai elmélet terén.

Apart from the large body of posthumous papers in the field of economic history - now being edited by Harry W. Pearson - Karl Polanyi's literary estate includes a number of writings on political and social philosophy.

extreme independence of his mind, his non-alignment with any political party or political movement accounts partly for the fact that these writings remained little known. Some exist in the form of manuscripts, some as mimeographs or contributions to short-lived or long extinct periodicals and were written in the early years of his life. Unpublished writings of his late years are ample and exist more often than not in many variants; some are fragments.

There are three marked stages.

The earliest writings, 1909-1919 are in Hungarian and center round the broad cultural student movement which he founded in 1908, named "Galileo Circle". Most of these were printed at the time in the periodical Szabadgondolat (Libre pensée). Titles include "Crisis of our ideologies" - "Destructive trends?" - "On dedication" - "Faith and credulity" - "The calling of this generation" - "A call to the youth of the Galileo Circle: Oration, held at the obsequies for the poet Endre Ady, February 1919". Polanyi's Afterwords to the student movement, written 20 and 50 years, respectively, after the inception of the "Galileo Circle" round off the strangely topical picture.

The next stage can best be described as a response to the incipient fascist doctrines of the 1920's and their emergence in the 1930's. These writings are partly in German, partly in English. Titles include "On freedom" - "The Left" - "The Essence of Fascism" (in: Christianity and the Social Revolution, London, 1955); Essays

on the early writings of Marx (which had become available for the first time in 1932), and a great number of contributions to the Bullstins of the Christian Left in England.

Polanyi's late writings in social and political philosophy center on the theme of industrial society and its challenge to man. Some of the titles are "The Economistic Fallacy" - "The good life in an industrial society" - "Freedom and technology" - "Aristotle and Galbraith on affluence" - "Marginal notes on the world trend towards socialism" - "For a New West", etc.

Some 40 titles of very varying lengths have so far been collected. Fragments, often contained in letters to friends are still turning up.
