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How to make progress towards peace? (collective security); The view that but for Germany there would be no problem, is a dangerous fallacy which should be rigidly rejected. (Vauntaphing),

This fallacy is dangerous because it implies that there is some way of dealing with Germany, which would resolve the question of peace (a) The world was <u>unstable</u> before the War, and therefore Wars will occur in it.
