To this purpose general ~~terminology~~ like "Decay of Capitalism" are insufficient.

We need a much fuller and closer understanding of the main aspects of this crisis, something to explain the great measure of inevitability in this process and the great measure in which actual solutions continue to depend upon deliberate human activity, upon individual sacrifice.

I. Where?

II. When?

Extension in time: In one way or another all the essential changes coming about during the course of the last 10 years or less. It is important to recognise that the Great War and the Peace treaties together with the commotions immediately following upon them were parts of a ~~closed~~ period of history, in fact the closing stage of the XIX century, probably the ~~last~~ and of the liberal national state era which emerged from the religious wars of the XVI century.

2. The Great War the same type of meaningless conflict of ~~Great~~ ^{groups of} Powers ~~as~~

Powers as is common under the system of liberal-national states. Their alignment as such means nothing or not much more than nothing.

b. The Peace Treaties, ^{not} the usual treaties.

c. The Post War revolutions the usual disintegration of governments following upon defeat.

d. The Post War counterrevolutions the usual back-swing of the balance, when traumatic changes are ~~momentarily~~ partly abolished again by the conservative forces asserting themselves, i.e. by reaction.

Insofar as ~~momentarily~~ achievements are the outcome (^{permanent} establishment of national states and constitutional governments) this is no new development but the necessary spreading towards the West of the process started by the French Revolution i.e. the establishment of national states and the ~~abolition of all forms of~~ destruction of feudalism.

BUT THIS PROCESS WAS IN THE MAIN AT AN END BY THE MIDDLE OF THE TWENTIES.

a. Russia. The NEP meant the end of the revolution. "Enrichissez-vous" (Bucharin.) The directorate phase. The Thermidor. The revolution had "spent itself."

The Five Years plan not only a new departure in theory and practice, but certainly a completely new departure as a process. No mechanical causation, no cause and effect or dialectical relationship between the End of the Russian Revolution and the infinitely more important development called the Five Years Plans. (Trotzky paid dearly for this disjunction). 1928.

b. Italy. Psychologically, Italy belongs to the group of defeated countries. Occupation of the Factories; Fascism only a name without a content (certainly not its specific content). Politically, it starts with January 1925, when the Aventine makes compromise impossible after the murder of Matteotti ("normalism," Mussolini's watchword). Economically, it is only after 1931 that the idea of the corporative state becomes a programme in the specific sense.

c. New Deal in USA. 1933. Nothing to do with War and Treaties.

d. Hitler in Germany. 1933 Only superficially determined by War and economic reasons. "Revisionism" ^{of G.} optimistic illusion. Letter to New Statesmen

(This does not mean that the same reasons which brought about the Great War are not ~~still~~ at work in this period. But if this is so, then the twenties are not a result of the Great War and Treaty period but of a set of forces at work behind both. The question is not when exactly the new period starts, but that it is a new era of history).

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III. B. Characteristics of the crisis; the transition to it, lying behind us we have passed the water-shed. Its characteristics are the following:

1/ Sudden, swift, vast changes become the rule.

2/ ^{landslide} Gradualism, as a method of change disappears completely. Change is not ~~the~~ the result of deliberate human will, efforts aimed at change. This is the characteristic of a period of disintegration. The biggest changes come about almost imperceptibly, over night. They happen between the worlds, between the malms, in the no man's lands of social stratification.

Two instances:

a. Internal economic system. It is sometimes sufficient to bring about this effect, because the rivetting was not intended to resist strain.

3/ Change happens in the world; the scene of happening is not ~~fore-~~ mostly the individual. The individual is faced with a changing world. The old formula of "Whether we wish to change the world and in what direction we ~~wish~~ wish it changed" becomes inapplicable". (The person who recently explained that a discussion on social philosophy ought to be carried on in the old type fashion: What kind of a world do ~~we~~ we want? What kind of a society do we wish to bring into existence"? - completely lost of touch with reality.). effort.

4/ ^{masses} Degree of change ~~is~~ not commensurate with degree of ~~effort~~. Small efforts bringing about vast changes. (While in the War terrific sacrifice brought about very little change).

(The theory of the ~~function~~ of time in society was middle class. Neither non-changing societies, nor ~~stable~~ changing ones explained. The idea of the inevitable deterioration of human institutions as a function of time, a bourgeois preconception). Atomism. Entropy.

In such a world the passing away of the old is inevitable, but the coming on of the new is not. Because the latter depending upon us. Upon our measure of preparedness. Upon the forces we contribute to the solution. THE LEVEL OF THE SOLUTION DEPENDING UPON THE INDIVIDUAL CONTRIBUTION.

IV. Crisis of what?

A) A crisis of our present social system, nationally and internationally. The characteristics of the crisis prove that the forces at work are of an objective nature. i.e. the process of history is everywhere working up towards a complete deadlock, which endangers the working of the economic and the political system under which we live to such a degree as to threaten to stop it altogether, suddenly and completely. This is the situation out of which

Fascism arises. Unless a conflict changes ~~out~~ politics. Fascism is a practical, Fascism, which is possible. Capitalist nations incapable to solve the problem of international economic cooperation and therefore leading to acute tension between the nations which destroys the possibility of an international

 tional economic order). No new order can be put into its place, for the basic lack of unity in a class society makes this impossible. Economic adjustment ~~is~~ causing dislocations which mean unemployment to the workers engaged. The working class cannot take ~~the~~ responsibility for a loss in economic standards under a system under which it has no responsibility in the economic system itself. In other words: The lack of unity in society makes it impossible to ~~PROGRESS~~ proceed to those massive sacrifices which would be needed to adjust economic conditions ~~and equalize them internationally.~~

In both respects the working class destined to lead society to a real solution.

a. The conflict between Capitalism and Democracy can be resolved only under the leadership of the working class in the direction of Democracy i.e. economic socialism.

b. The economic international community will be set up only by working class lead because only the working class capable of the massive sacrifice which is needed to this purpose. Raw materials and working hours.

 But the ~~MILITIA~~ precondition of usefulness is to possess the confidence of the working class in a crisis. This means keeping in touch ~~MILITIA~~ / the activities of the working class as they are. And this ~~at all~~ (with) costs.

Summary

What do we mean by our present society being under judgment?

Our present order of society is being destroyed in a series of wars and civil wars. This process has already begun. It can end only in the establishment of ~~MONDIALISM~~ an international socialist Commonwealth.
~~which has been achieved, the power of laboring and serving~~
~~An international socialist community can be established only if every~~
national and every ~~MONDIALISM~~ brings great sacrifices. The present class societies lack the unity needed to go onto such a step. ~~END~~ In the last resort capitalism must go because it destroys the unity of the nation, and it is only by great national sacrifices that ~~an~~ international society can be set up. First of all, the capitalists who would have to carry the loss, but even if they were inclined to do so, the working class could not take its share under ~~capitalism~~, because it has no responsibility for the carrying on of industry. ~~Socialism comes from~~
~~outside from the international sphere.~~
~~Under capitalism industry is a separate ^{accessory} part within~~
society. It is governed by its own laws. There are markets for everything, holding human labour. Man is a ~~monetary~~ ^{accessory} commodity that is bought and sold on the market.) ~~The struggle is on which of the~~
~~between capitalist nations, solution, and the defeat of~~
~~The tension has become so great that the international economic institu-~~
tuitions have broken down: The gold standard, capital markets and so on.
~~(Nominally capitalist~~ Some measure of planning is inevitable.
~~countries are putting on armours.~~ They become self-sufficient units. The political and the economic system must be unified: It is impossible to continue with loosely knit ~~MONDIALISM~~ societies. Everywhere in the world in one form or another such unification is going on. But ~~the two ways in which it happens,~~ there is a world of difference between the two ways in which it happens:

Political democracy is extended to include the economic system: that is socialism, or capitalism is maintained and the political system of democar-

democracy destroyed. In this form Fascism is maintaining capitalism and preparing for international anarchy.

Socialism is the precondition of a democratic state. in our time. The ~~army~~ ~~nation~~ depends on the strength of the ~~the~~ ^{working} class movement.

Here it is that we come in. We have to supply that element ~~of~~ ^{of} finality or conviction that nothing but religion can give.

The existence of Russia has precipitated the clash. Socialism is possible. it has been done.

The working classes will have to shoulder the burden of leadership and we must be there to imbue them with the strength.

We must teach the inevitability of the conflict.

The inevitability of the sacrifice.

The certainty of ultimate victory.

We must have the confidence of working people

Express our ~~beliefs~~ ^{beliefs} ~~faith~~ in the mission of
