

Simon Research Fellowship

These Fellowships were founded under the terms of a gift made by the Rt. Hon. Lord Simon of Wythenshawe, of Didsbury, in 1944 for the promotion of research and teaching in the Social Sciences, this term being construed in a wide sense. The Fellowships are intended to set free for research and writing men and women of mature years who are considered by the University to be capable of doing work likely to prove of practical importance. The Fellowships may be held wholly or partly in Manchester or may be used for travelling to any part of the world. The regulations were amended in 1953 to provide for the award of Simon Research Fellowships and Simon Senior Research Fellowships.

Regulations

1. The University will offer annually one or more Simon Research Fellowships for advanced study or research in the Social Sciences. The Fellowships will be open to candidates of about ten years' standing from the date of their first degree.
2. The Fellowships will be tenable for one year, with a possible extension to two years, and, in very exceptional circumstances, to three. The Fellow will be required to devote his whole time to the duties of the Fellowship.
3. The Fellowships shall normally be within the range of £700-1,100 p.a. (Simon Research Fellowships) or within the range of £1150-1500 per annum (Simon Senior Research Fellowships), according to the experience and qualification of the person elected. The emoluments of the Fellowships shall be payable quarterly, subject to the receipt of satisfactory ~~progress~~ reports of progress.
4. Fellows who are already members of the Federated Superannuation System for Universities shall continue their membership, and in other cases a Fellow who so desires may, with the consent of the University, be proposed for membership of the scheme. In all cases the full contributions shall be a charge on the emoluments of the Fellowship.
5. Fellows other than those who, at the time of election, are members of the staff of this University, will normally be required to be resident in Manchester during their period of tenure, but a fellow may be permitted to devote such periods as may be deemed desirable by the Simon Research Fund Committee to research elsewhere under conditions approved by the Committee.
6. During or immediately after his tenure of the Fellowship, the Fellow will be required to give a lecture or lectures in the University on the subject of his study or research. He will also be required to deposit in the University Library two copies of any memoir or book embodying the results of his study or research.

SIMON FELLOWSHIPS.

R E G U L A T I O N S

In all cases the full contribution shall be a charge on the emoluments of the Fellowship.
5. Fellows, other than those who, at the time of election, are members of the staff of this University will normally be required to be resident in Manchester during their period of tenure, but a Fellow may be permitted to devote such periods as may be deemed desirable by the Simon Research Fund Committee to research elsewhere under conditions approved by the Committee.
6. During or immediately after tenure of the Fellowship, the Fellow will be required to give a lecture or lectures in the University on the subject of his study or research. He will also be required to deposit in the University Library two copies of any memoir or book embodying the results of his study or research.

Applications must reach the Registrar of the University by 1st March in the year of application.
